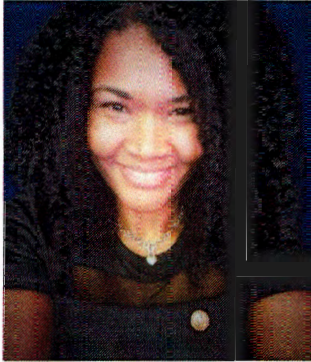

Antonesia “Toni” Wiley is the Director of Advocacy at the National Urban League Washington Bureau where she works with various organizational partners and community stakeholders to drive the Urban League's policy platform in Congress and at the grassroots level. She also directs the Congressional Advocacy Program and co-hosted and produced the National Urban League’s “For the Movement” podcast. Ms. Wiley is a former National Urban League Young Professionals ELT member who served two terms from 2015-2019 as the organization’s first National Advocacy Committee Chair.

Ms. Wiley has an extensive background in non-profit management with a focus on public health and minority health disparities. Prior to her work at the National Urban League, she was a senior manager overseeing compliance and process improvement for the American Red Cross’ national blood services and transfusion program.
